URGING THE SAN FRANCISCO HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION TO PROCLAIM SEPTEMBER 24 – SEPTEMBER 28, 2018 DIAPER NEED AWARENESS WEEK.

WHEREAS, the City and County of San Francisco Human Services Commission traditionally recognizes important opportunities to raise awareness in an effort to increase public health in our City; and

WHEREAS, Diaper Need, the condition of not having a sufficient supply of clean diapers to ensure that infants and toddlers are clean, healthy and dry, can adversely affect the health and welfare of infants, toddlers and their families; and

WHEREAS, national surveys report that one in three mothers experiencing diaper need at some time while their children are less than three years of age and forty-eight percent of families delay changing a diaper to extend their supply; and

WHEREAS, the average infant or toddler requires an average of at least 50 diaper changes per week over three years; and

WHEREAS, for a single mother with town children receiving CalWORKs, diapers can consume as much as 28% of her household budget; and

WHEREAS, recognizing that providing diapers can improve the health and financial stability of San Francisco's lowest-income families, the City and County of San Francisco have partnered with Help a Mother Out, a non profit organization, to create the San Francisco Diaper Bank, the first and only publicly-funded diaper bank in the nation, providing a full supply of diapers each month to families receiving CalWORKs who have children under the age of three; and

WHEREAS, over the last three years the San Francisco Diaper Bank has distributed over two million diapers to low-income families; and, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Human Services Commission proclaims September 24, 2018 to September 28, 2018 Diaper Need Awareness Week in San Francisco.
