

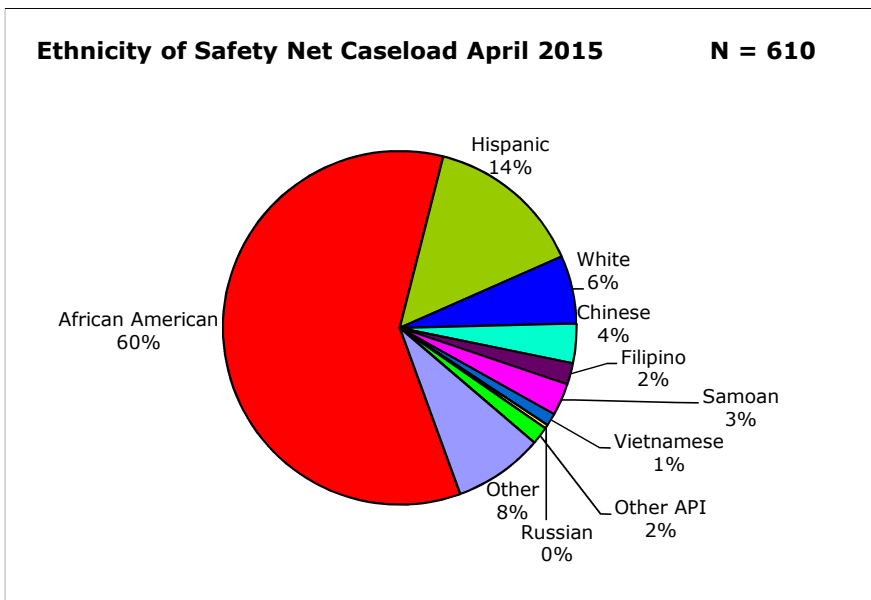
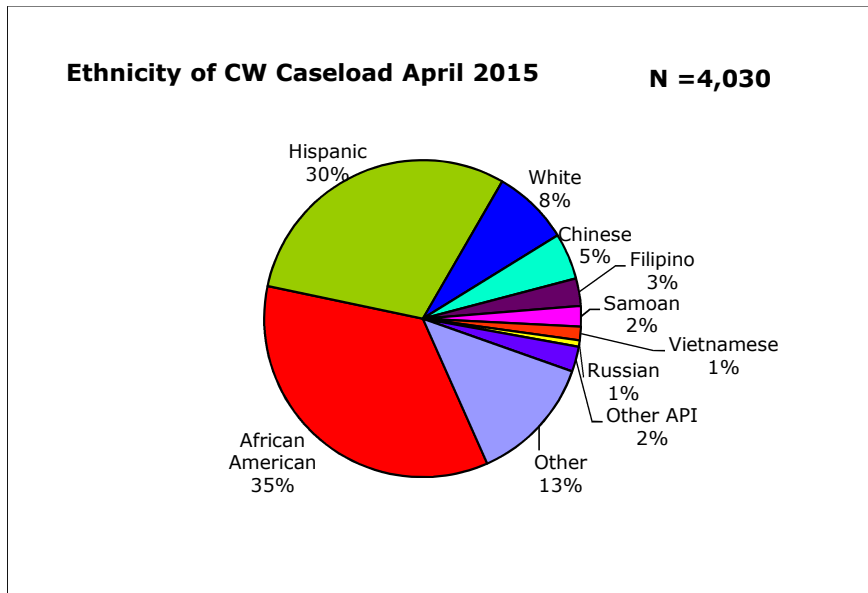

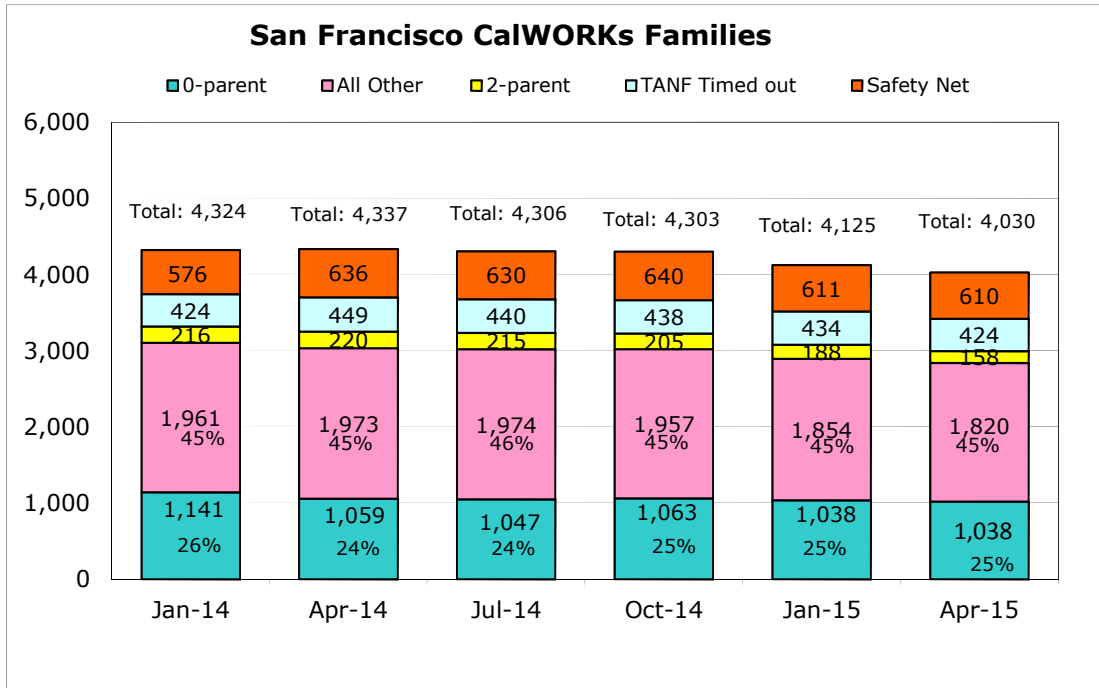
Since November 2014, CalWIN database separately identifies CalWORKs families that receive assistance under Trafficking and Crime Victims Assistance Program. There were 18 families in November 2014 which rose to 45 in April 2015, a rise of 150%.

**Recent Developments**

There has been a steady increase in the San Francisco Welfare To Work County Participation Rate in the past five Federal Fiscal Years:

FFY 2014	37%

In June 2014, for the first time, CalWORKs program achieved a significant milestone of reaching 50% WPR for All Families. The federal requirement for All Families county WPR is 50%.

The FFY 2014 data is from October 2013 through September 2014. The county has sustained the high WPR for the month of October 2014 at 49.6% (FFY 2015).
