

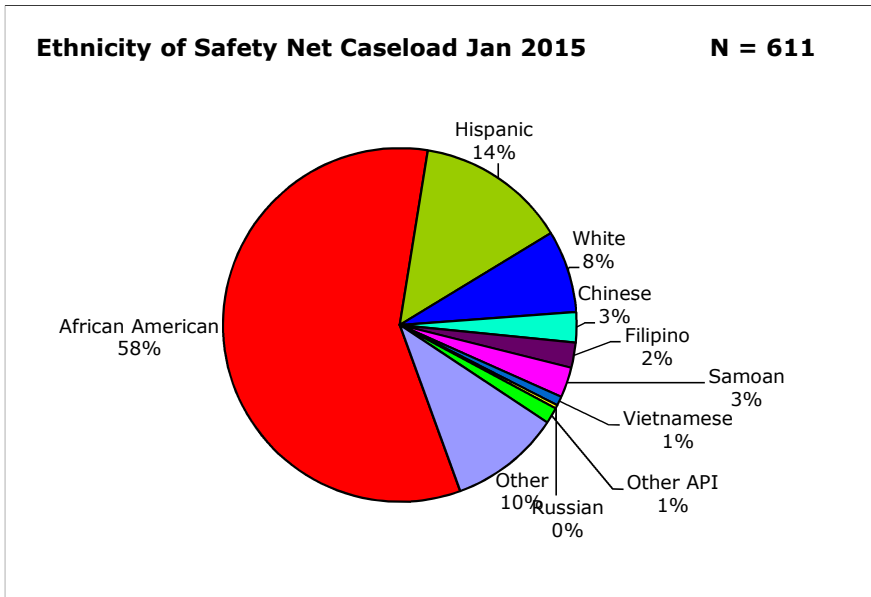
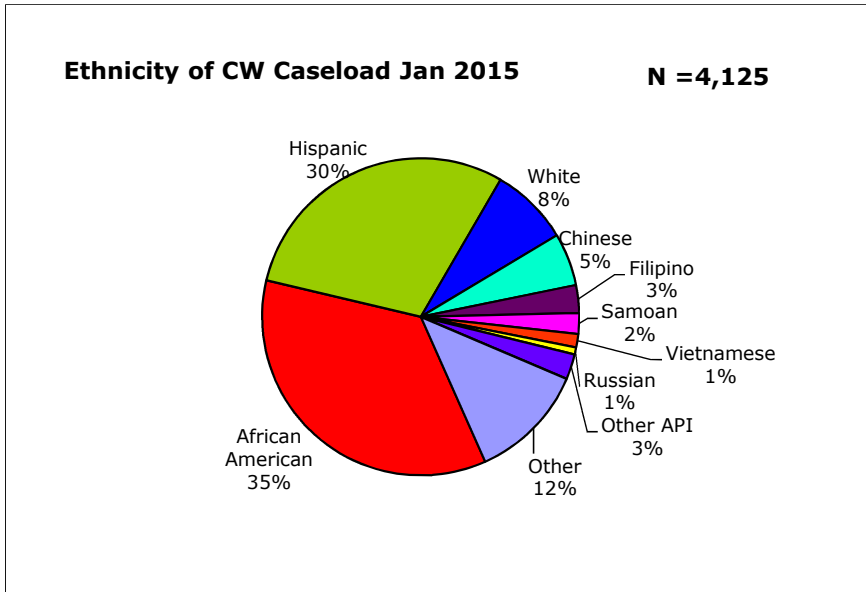

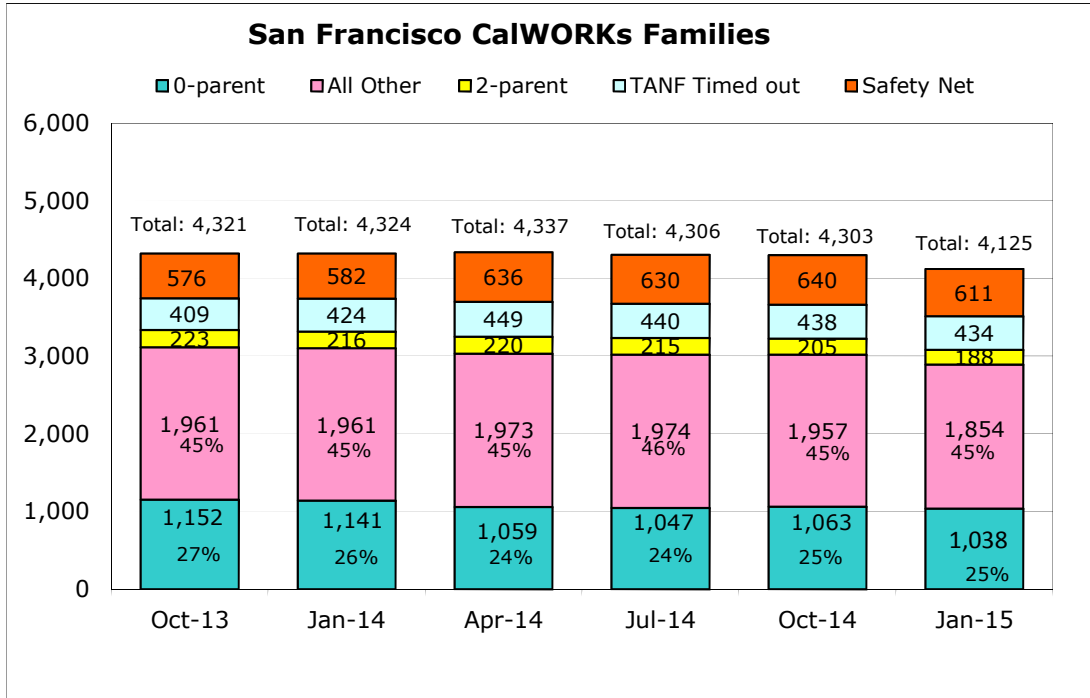
Since November 2014, CalWIN database separately identifies CalWORKs families that receive assistance under Trafficking and Crime Victims Assistance Program. There were 18 families in November 2014 which nearly doubled to 35 by January 2015.

Recent Developments

There has been a steady increase in the San Francisco Welfare To Work County Participation Rate in the past five Federal Fiscal Years:

In June 2014, for the first time, CalWORKs program achieved a significant milestone of reaching 50% WPR for All Families.

The federal requirement for All Families county WPR is 50%.

The FFY 2014 data is from October 2013 through August 2014.
