 - Updates of general action items including housing navigation development, SFMTA disability training updates, wheelchair repair program evaluation, expansion of patient portal training, and development of Disability Cultural District.

 - Sunset Dunes Barbara Chami
 - Rec & Parks reviewed progress on the Sunset Dunes project, including community feedback and recent approvals for accessibility improvements, with John completing an accessibility assessment expected in June and the Rec and Park Commission approving a Mobility and Access Project for pedestrian and bike separation.

- Permanent signage and ground stenciling expected to be completed in 2027. Alex clarified that money from the accessibility bond would be allocated to improve the Noriega entrance.
- Exploring installation of up to 10 new benches on the bridal trail.
- Hallidie Plaza Eli Gelardin
 - Eli Gelardin presented the Holidie Plaza redesign options, showing two ramp designs with different configurations.
 - Both design options aim to create a more welcoming and accessible public space, with an expanded plaza, increased green space and plantings, improved lighting, and a fully code-compliant ramp below 7.5% grade. The long-term vision includes a new elevator between street level and the lower plaza/BART/Muni, though this will require funding beyond the current Health and Safety Bond.
 - The community provided feedback on cost concerns, guardrails to deter skateboarding, and the potential for charging stations for medical equipment.
 - Eli invited the disability community, including ADF, to participate in programming discussions for the plaza, which is scheduled for construction in summer 2027.
