Ramaytush Ohlone Land Acknowledgement

Requesting authorization to enter into a new contract agreement with LA CASA DE LAS MADRES for provision of Domestic Violence Intervention Services for FCS Families; for the period of July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2030; in the amount of \$2,489,780 plus a 10% contingency for a total contract amount not to exceed \$2,738,758. Presented by Elena Wong.
- B. Requesting authorization to enter into a new contract agreement with REDWOOD TOXICOLOGY LABORATORY, INC., a subsidiary of Abbott Laboratories, Inc., for provision of Substance Abuse Testing Services for parents and/or caregivers of families involved with child welfare; for the period of July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2030; in the amount of \$1,200,000 plus a 10% contingency for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,320,000. - C.
